RULES AND REGULATIONS (cont.)

Jenny Dove (Saringa)

I was literally born into the dog world as my mother and godmother, the late Clare Race (Rifka) were heavily into Afghan Hounds.

I started showing the dogs in 1969 at the age of 13 and was very successful for many years.

Although dedicated to the Afghans, I had always really wanted an Irish Wolfhound so when I judged the breed at Kilkenny in 1980, I fell hopelessly in love and luckily bought my BOB winning bitch "Sinead of Cu Visneach".

Sinead won the bitch CC at her first show in the UK at Windsor in 1980 under the breed specialist Lydia Pringle and quickly gained her title in that same year.

She was successfully mated to IR & UK Ch. Nutstown King producing a lovely winning litter.

I continued to breed, only occasionally, when wanting something to show myself and I managed in one year to have produced three brothers who were the top winning Wolfhounds in their respective countries.

Saringa's Mr Magwitch of Nutstown in the USA, Saringa's Mr Cratchit in Canada & Saringa's Mr Dawkins in Hungary. I think it was the same year that our own Saringa's Mr Micawber was the top dog in the UK, he also won the coveted Contest of Champions (Champion of Champions) in 1998 and BOB & Group 4 at Crufts in 1999. Mr Micawber was the older brother of the first three mentioned.

My late husband and I also provided the official mascot for the London Irish Rugby Club and over the years they had three generations of our stock. We also used to lead the Saint Patrick's day parade through London every year for many years, that was always a very hectic but thrilling event. The dogs were always so marvellous with the big bands and thousands of people and never one toilet accident or embarrassment, except when Jumbo, the first dog we used ate a kiddies ice cream before the toddler had even realised his treat had been delicately removed from the his grip!

I'm thrilled to be invited to judge the Society show especially as when the Society was first formed, the committee meetings were held in my 17th century pub near Reading.

- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.
Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Ltd licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Ltd Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Ltd Rules and Regulations.
Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Ltd Regulation to refuse any entry.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Ltd registered.
 19. All entries must be made on or before **Monday 16th September 2024** (Postmark)
 20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Ltd Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Ltd Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule 42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.
 - (d) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club Ltd before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club Ltd in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club Ltd. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club Ltd will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
- 7 Best Breeder in Breed Award entries will be taken up to 2pm on the day of the show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 08.30a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 09.30am
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEES: Members and Associates £16.00 First Entry Per Dog; Non-Members £18.00 First Entry Per Dog; Subsequent Entries same dog—Members... Free. Subsequent Entries same dog—Non Members...£2.00 NFC (Not For Competition) No charge.
FULL/ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP FEES: Single £12.00; Joint £18.00; Overseas £15.00.
6. PRIZE MONEY: There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserve to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However the Societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at **all Kennel Club licensed Shows**.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show**
 - a. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is **unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show**. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - b. **Withdrawal from Other Competition**
Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - c. **Proviso**
For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
11. **Best in Show**
 - a. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
 - b. **Withdrawal from other competition**
Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
 - c. **Proviso**
For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11
14. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Ltd Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Ltd Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS**
Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK during hot weather and the Kennel Club Ltd offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club Ltd. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club Ltd which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars of more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **MONDAY 9th SEPTEMBER 2024**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If the exhibitor reports before the judging of any class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) WITHDRAWAL. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F. (1). 19.
- (2) TRANSFER. a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. F(1) 9K (2) (b)

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY:

For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY:

For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR:

For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING:

For Dogs of twelve but not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show

NOVICE:

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE:

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT:

For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under three different judges or seven or more First prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN:

For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN:

For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

CHAMPION:

For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion or Show Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club

BRACE:

For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

Stud Dog and Brood Bitch Trophies

These trophies will be awarded annually at the Society's Championship show in September based on points won by progeny at the Society's shows commencing with the Championship show in September 2023, the Championship show and Open show in January 2024 and presented at the Championship show in September 2024.

Points will be awarded as follows:-

Best of Breed	6 points
Best Dog	5 points
Best Bitch	5 points
Reserve Best Dog	4 points
Reserve Best Bitch	4 points
Best Puppy	4 points
Classes	
First place	3 points
Second place	2 points
Third place	1 point

Note that any one show points are not cumulative, 6 points is the most a dog can win at a show.

Example 1: If you win Best of Breed your overall points for the show is 6, you do not count any other placing's.

Example 2: If you have a first place in one class and a second place in another class your overall total for the show is 3 points.
